Aims and objectives

- To provide a theoretically informed description of Modern English grammar.
- To clarify the typological position of English, identify diachronic biases in familiar descriptions of English, and trace the influence of English on theories of grammar.
- To contrast competing approaches and isolate substantive disagreements.
- To highlight points of contact between grammar and other linguistic domains.

Grading policy

Assignments (20%)

There are two sets of assignments. In weeks 2, 5 and 7 there are self-assessed error analysis tasks that provide practice in recognizing and correcting common errors. In weeks 3 and 6 there are instructor-assessed grammatical analysis exercises that help to develop skills in pattern recognition and problem solving. Only the grammatical exercises will be graded.

Class participation (20%)

The weekly exercises provide the basis for interactive discussions on the Discussion Board. For full grades, students should complete two of the following tasks **each week**:

1. **Ask** a question in the Course Discussion Board on Blackboard, and **either**
2. **Answer** a question posed in the Course Discussion Board **or**
3. **Comment on** an answer in the Course Discussion Board.

Midterm exam (30%)

There will be a take-home midterm exam due at the end of week 4. The exam format will include a combination of true-false, multiple choice, short answer, and/or matching questions, all based on material drawn from the required readings and class lectures.

Comprehensive Final (30%)

The final exam will be due at the end of week 8. The exam will be comprehensive, covering topics from weeks 1–8. It will have the same format as the midterm, with true-false, multiple choice, short answer, and/or matching questions, based on the readings and lectures.
